

What is Webelos Woods?

Webelos Woods is an overnight experience for Webelos Scouts and a parent or guardian. The Webelos Scout will have the opportunity to experience a 'Day in the Life' of Scout BSA Troop. This is an opportunity to camp out with your Scout and enjoy the beauty of Camp Davy Crockett on the banks of Cherokee Lake. Your Scout will have the opportunity to work towards adventure pins, experience the multitude of activities and begin to understand the concept of the Patrol Method and the differences between Cub Scouting and Scouts BSA

Campsites

Campsite assignments are made by District and/or community, Scout BSA Troop members and Adults will be assigned Tents and are responsible for providing their own tent for the weekend. The Wall tents that are available during summer camp are stored for the winter. WEBELOS and Arrow of Light Scouts and Adults are provided spaces in cabins and are assigned upon your arrival. Each Cabin will have a sign on it indicating who is in each cabin. Drinking water is available at the campsite as well as a trashcan. Do not store food in tents or cabins.

Food Planning

Because cooking outdoors is such a big part of camping, units will be cooking the meals for the weekend in the campsites. Packs and Troops will provide their own food and cooking equipment. If you do not have cooking gear, check with your local Scout Troop. Your campsite guide will be available to assist you. There is water available in each campsite.

Personal Gear Checklist

- Sleeping bag (good to at least 40o or lower)

- A good supply of dry clothes (especially socks)
- An extra pair of shoes and socks for sleeping
- Rain gear
- Personal first aid kit
- Plate, cup, eating utensils
- Personal toiletries
- Soap
- Towel and/or washcloth
- Any medications you may require
