V. Trip Description

Trip consists of truck-in camping at Backbone Rock Campground with climbing and rappelling activities. The group will arrive Friday evening around 6:00 PM. (Backpackers will arrive Saturday morning). Most of Saturday and Sunday afternoons will be spent rappelling and maybe rock climbing. Beginners are welcome; we will have a "prep school" 10-ft high course plus the usual 40-ft descent and others depending upon our resources. A nice stream and rapids beside the campground are added attractions for fishing. (THERE WILL BE NO SWIMMING) We will arrive at the campground around 6:00 PM, will set up camp, eat a sack dinner. The climbing and rappelling team will be reviewing plans. Patrols should plan on a campfire in the area next to the shelter using the portable firepit. The Friday campfire theme will be participation games.

Following breakfast and with good weather on Saturday the climbing and rappelling crew will set up stations at the rock. There will be a safety briefing in the picnic area before climbing starts. Participants should be prepared to spend most of the day there. (Have your durable sack lunch with you). Supper will be prepared by patrols from their pre-planned menus. Will use cooking fires and/or propane stoves. Will hold a traditional Troop 48 campfire next to the big log shelter. Bring stories, jokes, songs to share. Sunday breakfast and lunch will also be by patrols from preplanned menus. There will be a church service Sunday morning and more activities in the early afternoon. We plan to clean up campsites and be on the road before 5 pm.
